Event: **March Troop Campout and BSA 101 Campout**

Where: Pohick Bay Regional Park, Group Campground Sites A4, A5, and A6

When: Arrive/Depart: Regular Patrols – 6:00/6:30 pm, **Friday, Mar 19**, Vale Church
New Scout Patrol – 7:00/8:00 am, **Saturday, Mar 20**, Vale Church
Return: 12:00 pm, **Sunday, Mar 21**, Vale Church

What: This campout consists of two parallel activities.

- The Regular patrols will be camping Friday thru Sunday. They will focus on doing an afternoon orienteering course and cooking skills. Patrols will select menus for all meals only from the troop's library of cook books. Emphasis will be on open fire cooking, fresh ingredients, and the food groups. There will also be opportunities to work on any of the "outdoor skill" requirements.
- The New Scout patrol will camp Saturday thru Sunday. BSA 101 is the focus of their time in the park. Select senior scouts and adult leaders will plan and conduct this training program. The purpose of BSA 101 is to get our New Scout patrol(s) familiar with boy scout camping, the patrol method, and begin them on the advancement trail. Senior scouts should contact ASM Livelsberger or ASM Nelson if you can help for all or part of the event.

Food: Patrols will plan menus and buy food. New Scout patrol menus and food will be planned and provided by their Troop Guide/BSA 101 Staff. We will not stop for dinner on Friday night.

Costs: Scouts/adults: \$10 for food + \$12 camping fee = \$22
New Scout patrol: \$10 food + \$6 camping fee = \$16
