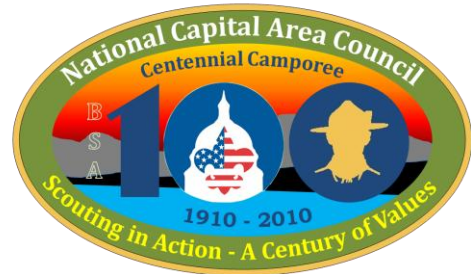

Preregistration online (closed)

Oct 9 – Dec 15, 2009:

Full registration (unit, activities, meal tickets, final payment)

Subject to district projections – applications exceeding district projections

will be wait-listed and treated as preregistrations, subject to availability

Packs *should not include* Webelos who will cross over in the spring.

Camp site will be assigned when full payment is received.

April 15, 2010

Final date for troops to add Webelos cross-overs, with full payment.

Medical Requirements: Medical Forms A and C for all participants, including non-member parents and siblings. No full physicals required. Forms to be retained for reference by the attending unit.

ADA Needs: Identify requirements at time of registration. Will require State-issued ADA tag.

Parking: Generally, no personal vehicles will be permitted on the Goshen Scout Reservation. Exceptions, for Venturers and to deliver equipment only, are explained in the on-line registration process.

Cub Scouts: Camping and program at Camp Ross.
Weekend family camping offered to parents and siblings of Tigers, Wolves and Bears.
Webelos will camp as Dens.
Will be shuttled to/from Camp Post for Sunday Centennial Arena Show

Boy Scouts: Camping at Camps Olmsted and Bowman; program at Camp Post and on Lake Meriweather.

Venturers: Camping at Camp Marriott; program in vicinity of Camps Marriott and Camp Post.

Camporee Staff: Camping at Farm House, north of Camp Olmsted.

Meals: Responsibility of the family or unit, whether self-prepared or purchased from vendor, except for Sunday lunch for Cub Scout and Webelos participants, which is included in the Cub Fun Day \$15 fee and Webelos \$25 fee (youth and adult). Meal tickets may be optionally purchased during the registration process.
